CANADIAN DICTATORS OF CHRISTIAN SCIENCE



MRS. AUGUSTA STETSON, WHO PREDICTS RESURRECTION OF MRS. EDDY.

Mary Baker Eddy's death has made a Canadian the supreme authority in the Christian Science cult. His name is Archibald McLellan, and he was born in Moncton, N. B. Nov. 10, 1857.

Stephan A. Chase, the treasurer of the Mother Church, is also a director. He is a retired tanner, and lives at Fall River, Mass. Mr. Chase claims to have been cured of blood poisoning as the result of Christian Science treatment, the miracle making him a staunch member of the so-called religion.

The fourth director is Allison V. Stewart, publisher of "Science and Health" and other books of Mrs. Eddy's. Before becoming a Christian Science publisher, he was in the publishing business in Chicago. John V. Dittmore, clerk of the Mother Church and the fifth director, used to be general superintendent of a packing concern in Indianapolis. For seven years he was in charge of the publicity department of Christian Science in New York. None of the directors is a college man; all of them were successful in business before consecrating themselves to the work of Christian Science.

The Stetson Case. It may be that the unsettled case of Mrs. Augusta E. Stetson, the deposed and excommunicated New York leader of the Mother Church, will test the mettle of the directorate. It is true that Mrs. Stetson has publicly renounced all ambition to succeed Mrs. Eddy, but such a statement would not seriously discourage her partisans. In fact, if she were determined to become the leader of the church her proper course would be to deny any move in this direction, and leave the impetus to come from her "friends." Mrs. Stetson reiterated her loyalty to Mrs. Eddy, "my forever leader," but avers no allegiance to the Board of Directors. She does not recede from her original claim to the effect that she is "further advanced in Divine metaphysics than any other." If the majority of the Christian Scientists could be brought to share this belief, there would be little doubt of Mrs. Stetson's elevation. At the present moment the directors fear that Mrs. Stetson's activities will be directed toward the dissolution of the organized and material church, on the ground that Mrs. Eddy herself contemplated such a step, and desired the church to continue after her as a "spiritual essence."

Predicts Resurrection Coming. Mrs. Stetson declared recently in a statement to the press her explicit belief in the resurrection of Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy, founder of Christian Science, "in the semblance of human form." Mrs. Eddy, she said, when she returns to earth, will stay here "until her work is finished."

"The Gospel of Christ has ended; the millennium is at hand," she said. Exactly when the resurrection will take place, Mrs. Stetson did not know but she was convinced that it would be hastened if the board of directors of the "Mother Church," at Boston, revised or altered the manual of the church.

Mrs. Eddy, who was the female Christ, when she returns to earth, I am watching and waiting for the manifestation of a human form. It may come today, it may come next week, it may not come for ten years, but it will surely come, and its coming will be hastened if an attempt is made to alter the rule of Christian Science as it appears in the manual of the church.

"The millennium is at hand, Mrs. Eddy is not dead. She is still alive and when she appears again on earth it will be as herself as Mary Baker Eddy."

Mrs. Stetson compared the board of directors of the Mother Church in Boston with the disciples of Christ in the upper room. They are discussing her as if she were dead," she said, "whereas she still lives. The whole field of Christian Science has been demoralized by the unfaithfulness of those who should have the most faith."
