"I say that this Government has been active in the interests of the working man. We have accomplished many things in their behalf, the greatest of all being the passage of the Workmen's Compensation Act at the last session of the Legislature, an act which came into force on

at the last session of the Legislature, an act which came into force on July 1st last. "The effect of that act is to make a man's title to his money simply the fact that he was hurt while working for somebody else. Before the Government passed this act he had to prove a large number of things which served to make it difficult, and in many cases absolutely impos-sible, to receive compensation for the injuries he had received. Today he shows his bleeding arm, his smashed foot or his injured head. That is all he requires today. And in case of death from injuries the matter of receivery is also a simple process. Acting for stresmship companies I have sent out three cheques for \$2,000 each to the widows and orphans of these poor unfortunate mon who net their death while working in of those poor unfortunate men who niet their death while working in the steamer. 


