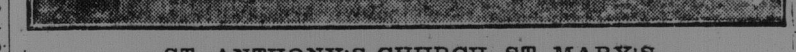




on the nave and aisle principle, the water of these together being forty-three feet and the length ninety feet, height from ground to ridge of nave forty-eight feet. A tower twelve feet square projects from the full size of the nave on the west end. One of these at each side of the front corners. One of these finishes a little above the aisle, with a low square spire roof; the other, together with a well proportioned spire, rises ninety-one feet above the surfaces above ground, and have freestone quoins to all angles and window reveals. The building was designed by J. C. Manserque & Son, of Halifax, and is in the French style, the exterior of the exterior is painted a pretty cream color, tinted with green, and the interior is painted in cream and gold.

The work on the building was carried out by local men, and goes to show that local firms can compare favorably with the



from abroad. The carpentry work was done under the direction of Lewis Boone of St. Mary's; W. Bruce Dayton had charge of the painting; Edward Hurley looked after the plumbing arrangements; and the J. C. Risteen Company manufactured the woodwork, including the handrails, and the new stairs.



The altar and fittings and the handsome stained glass windows were donated by parishioners and friends of the parish.

There are three front entrances to the ground floor: one in each tower and one in the centre of the building, the latter placed in a deep recessed projection with pediment hood and buttresses. At each side of the rear end of the building is a

The superstructure is framed with seasoned spruce and handomely finished with Gothic windows, buttresses, corbices, circular corner pinnacles to front and tower angles, all with curved finials. The gable

The front entrance lead to a spacious vestibule, which runs across the full width of the building, moulding the floor. There is a stairway in each tower leading to the basement and to the gallery; the vestibule is communicating the vestibule.

The auditorium is finished with a handsome, but plain partition finished with a balustrade. The audience room ceiling is finished with embossed steel of latest design in groin form with ribs resting on carved capitals to the nave columns, and finishes thirty-one feet above the audience floor in the nave.

The walls are finished in the rough style of plastering, with maincoating of California red wood, and the effect, while simple, is very pretty.

**Beautiful Altar.**

The altar, which is a splendid specimen of the Gothic, was manufactured by Louis
