These Elections Protest.
After the election of Dr. Tupper in Cumberland, Hon. Mr. Annand having been the leader of the opposition to him, a protest was entered by Mr. Annand's defeated candidate—Mr. Annand publicly offered \$2000 of his own money for the use of Dr. Tupper, and, as leader of the Nova Scotia Government, declined to commission the judges of the Supreme Court to try election cases, and had a warrant to whom a County Court Judge had been promised appointed to try the case. With tribulation among witnesses, and a County Court Judge as a prize for the ad hoc Judge, it was expected that Tupper's case was settled. But the money and the prize failed, and Mr. Annand's representative was forced by want of any kind of evidence, this or that, against the sitting member, to abandon the protest.

There was another case in Pictou. The sitting member, Carhart and Dawson, were protested against, and another of Mr. Annand's former County Judges was commissioned to clear, not complain, then. The evidence proved positive wholesale bribery by agents, and indirect bribery by the principals themselves, but Mr. Annand's money did not come, and the members as pure as snow, this fully carrying the promised reward. To show how clear the evidence against the sitting members was we give the following synopsis of a small portion of it:
John Logan swore that he received money from John Logan to vote for Carhart and Dawson.
John Logan swore that he might have given the money, but does not remember it. Also, that Tavis Marshall got a baronet after the election. Also, that he gave twenty or thirty dollars to John McLeod and took his note when the election came to talk to him about the election; also, that John Kerr got ten dollars to pay for getting his father to the polls.
John Logan swore that he offered five or ten dollars to a son of David Murray to pay for getting his father to the polls.
John Logan swore that he offered him \$100 to stop at home and not vote for McLeod and Dawson.
