Pout the title of the Indiano in the fee of the tublic hands or of any portion thereof has never been acknowledged by Sovernment but on the contrary is distinctly denied. In no case has any special agreement been made with any of the tribes of the Mainland for the extinction of their claims of possession but these claims have been held to have been fully satiohed by securing to each tribe , as the progress of the settlement of the country ocemed to require - the use of outficient tracts of land for their wants for agricultural and pastoral purposes.
