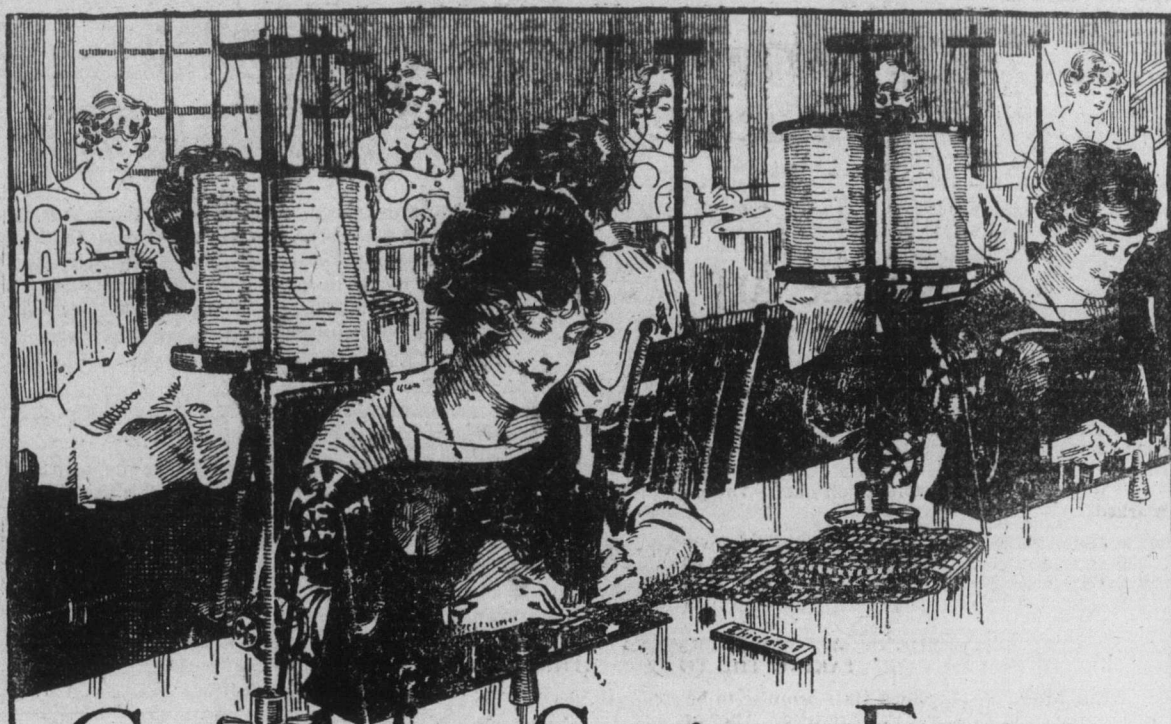

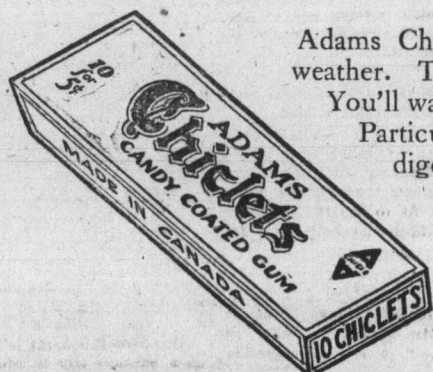

Cabinet Changes Are Now Expected

TWO NEW NAMES MENTIONED

OTTAWA, May 16.—The report that Major Humf Cronyn, M.P. for London, and Dr. Manion will be taken into the Cabinet is one of the speculative subjects that abound at Ottawa in a dull session. Someone is always making and unmaking the Cabinet, so far as talk is concerned.

The only Cabinet maker, the only one who has a say, is the prime minister, who has been away six months in Paris. He has not been considering that question at all.

When he comes back other things will first engage his attention and finally Cabinet reconstruction. Both Major Cronyn and Dr. Manion are popular and able members, but not more popular than some others.

The ministers whom rumor has assigned them to succeed, come from New Brunswick and Manitoba.

Cabinet Top Heavy
The Cabinet already is rather top heavy with Ontario representatives, and it is unlikely that two more will be added from this province unless to replace present Ontario ministers.

Before the Cabinet is reorganized the question will have to be settled as to whether the union and the Unionist party are to continue. There are doubts on both scores.

Major Cronyn and Dr. Manion are both Liberal Unionists and both Cabinet material, but the report about their coming in emanates, as stated, not from the premier, but from people who think they would make suitable timber for a Cabinet.

There is no question of their competency but their selection is another thing.

SPREAD OVER TEN YEARS

Ottawa, May 16. Federal support for technical education aggregating ten million dollars within the next ten years, the money to be paid to the provinces, is provided for in a resolution of which notice has been given by Hon. J.A. Calder, Minister of Immigration and Colonization. It reads in part:

2. That for the purpose of promoting and assisting technical education in Canada, the following sums, aggregating \$10,000,000, shall be appropriated and made available for payment out of the consolidated revenue fund of Canada, during each fiscal year for the period of ten years beginning with the year ending March 31, 1920, namely:

March 31, 1920, \$700,000; (b) during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1921, \$800,000; (c) during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1922, \$900,000; (d) during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1923, \$1,000,000; (e) during the fiscal year ending March 31, 1924, \$1,000,000, and the like sum of \$1,000,000 during each of the succeeding fiscal years until the expiration of the fiscal year ending March 31, 1929.

Provincial Expenditure
That the grant payable to any province in any year shall not exceed an amount equivalent to that which the Provincial Government shall expend on technical education within such year.

All payments shall be applied and used for technical education in the manner agreed upon by the Minister and the Government of each province. Every such agreement shall be approved by the Governor-in-Council. No portion of any grant shall be used in meeting any liability or expenditure incurred in any province prior to the first day of July, 1919, for lands. Not more than 25 per cent. of the annual grant payable to any province shall be

applied for securing land, erecting or extending or improving buildings or supplying furnishings and equipment. The Minister shall be the sole judge of all questions and differences that may arise under the proposed legislation or under any agreement made in pursuance of the proposed legislation.

The proposed legislation shall not apply to any province until the Government thereof has by order-in-Council approved its provisions and signified its desire to take advantage thereof.
