

NEW BRUNSWICK.

LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR :

The Honorable LEMUEL ALLAN WILMOT, D.C.L., Q. C. B. in Co. Sunbury, N. B., 1809. Ed. at the University, Fredericton, from which he subsequently obtained the degree of D. C. L. Called to the Bar, N. B., 1832. Created Q. C., 1838. Appointed Judge of the Supreme Court, 1851; and Lieutenant Governor of New Brunswick, 14 July, 1868. Is Vice-President of the Educational Union of Eng. and Wales, and Lt.-Col. 1st Batt. York Co. Militia. Entered Parlt. of N. B., 1834, where he continued to sit for many years, and was the leader of the Liberal party in the Assembly of that Province. Was a delegate to Eng., 1836, on the subject of the transfer of the Crown revenues and the payment of the Civil List. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, without office, from 1843 to 1845, when he resigned, and again, with office of Attorney-General, from 1848 to 1851.
