CUTLER, ROBERT BARRY, J.P. [*Kent.*]

Family came from Eng. to Massachusetts late in 17th Century; grandf., Capt., Eben Ezer Cutler, espoused the Royal cause at breaking out of revolution, was conspicuous for his zeal and loyalty, and, in consequence of his life being in danger, was compelled to fly to N.S. where he settled at Annapolis Royal; his eldest s., Eben, subsequently removed to N.B. Third s. of the latter. B. in Westmorland, N.B., 11 Augt., 1810. Ed. at Annapolis Grammar school M., 1831, Henrietta F., dau. of Benjamin Charters Esq., of Dorchester, N.B. A Commissioner, with W. McD. Dawson, Esq., to settle Canada disputed Territory Fund, 1855; and an asst. paymaster on Intercolonial Railway, 1867-72. Sat for Kent a N.B. Assembly from 1850 to 1856. Contested
