ADDITIONAL

Rules and Standing Orders.

- LXIII.—RESOLVED, That it is the undoubted constitutional right of the Legislative Council, to have a voice in all Bills of Aid or Supply, or Money of any kind, levied upon the people of this Province by the Legislature thereof, and in all Bills for Appropriation of the same, whatsoever the purpose may be.
- LXIV.—RESOLVED, That the said right extends to the approval or rejection of all Bills of Aid or Supply or Monies aforesaid, and of all Bills of Appropriation for the whole or any part of such Aid or Supply or such Monies, and that no legal appropriation can be made without the concurrence of the three Branches of the Legislature.
- LXV.—RESOLVED, That the Legislative Council will not proceed upon any Bill of Aid or Supply, which shall not, within the knowledge of this House, have been applied for, by the King's Representative in this Province.
- LXVI.—RESOLVED, That the Legislative Council will not proceed upon any Bill appropriating public money, that shall not within the knowledge of this House, have been recommended by the King's Representative.
- LXVII.—RESOLVED, That the Legislative Council will not proceed upon any Bill of Appropriation, for
