It was decided to have a child oriented program for the Dec. 16 meeting which will include a full length cartoon and Christmas films.

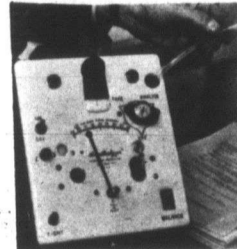

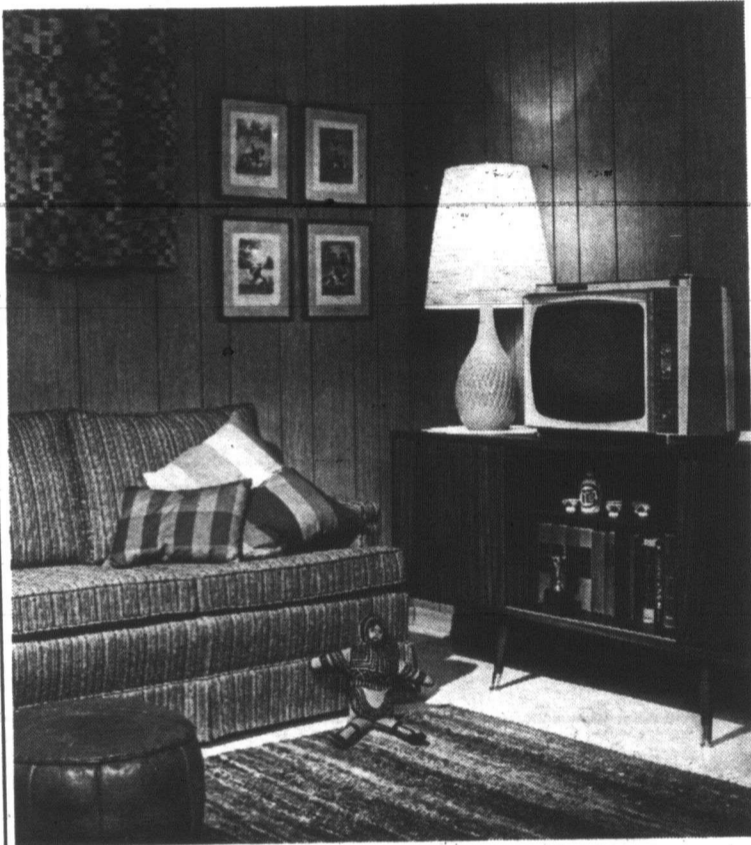
