SIR:

Referring to the correspondence in connection with the building of the R. C. Church at Cape Croker which will shortly be completed in a very satisfactory way. It will be a substantial and beautiful church.

The Indians have graded up and made ditches around it to take off the surface water, and Father Ladd the Parish Priest is procuring orchard grass and lawn grass seed. It requires a nice fence and gates in order to protect the grounds and beautify the building and also give it a finished appearance. The cost would likely be from fifty to seventy five dollars according to the style of fence. They want an artistic fence in front and half way back. The rest would do good strong common fence. It is also necessary to make things comfortable and complete, to have a good warm stable frame. The cost would be in the neighborhood of two hundred and twenty five dollars. It might be built on a cheap scheme but would not be in keeping with the grand church.

Now these things are necessary, and we will get no rest until they are done. They have spoken to me about it from time to time during the summer, but I said wait until
