

that the land being more than they could cultivate, and as it afforded but little in addition for the support of themselves and families, they were prevailed upon to represent their situation and to pray that they might be permitted to dispose of a portion of their grant, to raise a fund for their support, which was permitted and the sums arising from those sales, were remitted to England through me to the amount of several thousand pounds, and invested in the funds, from which they receive annually several hundred pounds, through Commissioners appointed for that purpose in the Upper Province, one of whom is the Deputy Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, and could have given all the information required.

Mr. Thero being as he represents, the Grandson of the late Sir William Johnson, and of Mrs. Brant, the sister of the late Captain Brant, and a Daughter of one of the Principal Chiefs of the Mohawk Nation, always considered as the first or head of the Six Nations, who, for the many long, and faithful services rendered them, and from the affection, respect, and veneration they hold them in remembrance have endeavoured, by this act of kindness, to perpetuate it, by a stronger Bond of affection and friendship, in
