With reference to the encunts which have been allowed I beg to may that the appropriation as the disposal of the Department will not statt of assistance to the extent asked for being afforded to individual Indiana. The appropriation is only intended for the relief of these persons who are unable, either through illinear or other infimity,

Indians to understand that they should depend upon their own exertions , and not upon the Department.

The accounts should be sent in in the usual way for payment.
