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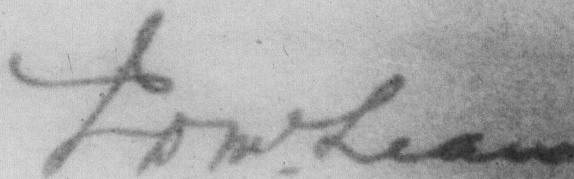
Ottawa 28th July, 1903.

I have again to remind you that when you transmit money to the Department, which you have collected on account of timber dues, etc., you should state the names of the persons from whom the collections were made.

With your letter of the 17th instant, you sent a draft for \$91.95. You stated that the amount was \$89.20, and that you paid the difference (25¢) for the draft. You should ~~stated~~ have stated in your letter from whom you collected the amount in question. Be good enough to give this information as it is necessary to have such particulars in all cases.
