In reply to your letter of October Ist. presenting applications for the admission of Norman Colin, Kenneth Colin, Jonsie Campbell and Amelia Anderson as pupils at the Brandan Industrial School, I have to inform you that under the circumstancos surrounding these cases the Department consents somewhat reluctantly to their admission. It is not thought desirable to bring children from the far North to the Brandon Industrial School, and as you are aware the restrictions concerning the admission of half-breads are well defined. These admissions must not therefore be taken as a precedent, and you should endeavor to be guided in future by the fact that it is not thought advisable to bring children from the North to the Brandon ladustrial School and unless they are living with Indians and as Indians upon Heserves.
