Reverend Sir,-

In reply to your letter of October 1st. presenting applications for the admission of Norman Golin, Kenneth Golin, Jessie Campbell and Amelia Anderson as pupils at the Brandon Industrial School, I have to inform you that under the circumstances surrounding these cases the Department consents somewhat reluctantly to their admission. It is not thought desirable to bring children from the far North to the Brandon Industrial School, and as you are aware the restrictions concerning the admission of half-breeds are well defined. These admissions must not therefore be taken as a precedent, and you should endeavor to be guided in future by the fact that it is not thought advisable to bring children from the North to the Brandon School or to admit half-breeds unless they are living with Indians and as Indians upon Reserves.
