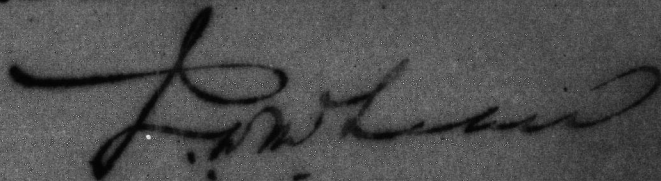
Sir,-

I enclose herewith for your information a letter which the Department received from Dr. Wilfrid C. Bliss, of Prince Albert, together with his account of \$65.00 for attendance upon two Indian children and a letter in the matter addressed to him by Mr. Borthwick.

You will observe that Dr. Bliss states he was requested by the Hospital Authorities at Prince Albert to attend the children. It seems strange that the Superintendent of the hospital ^{did} ~~would~~ not communicate with you before calling upon Dr. Bliss to render attendance. Kindly inquire carefully into the case. Seemingly the attendance rendered was necessary. If you find that the services were rendered as stated, you may submit a voucher in the Doctor's favor for the amount which you think he is entitled to receive.

Kindly notify the Hospital Authorities of the course which they should follow in future cases.
