The Department desires to have you make an inspection, at an early date, of the Griswold Indian Agency.

When reporting the result of your inspection you should state whether the arrangement under which the Indian Agent lives at Griswold is altogether satisfactory. I may remind you that his removal to Griswold was the result of a servent which he submitted to the Department in August, 1913, when he stated he would be prepared to pay rent in that town for the first year af allowed to live there instead of on the reserve. In your letter of the 22nd. September of that year you stated, - "Mr. McDoneld "claims that he can have a better oversight of the Indians "re whicky at Griswold than at the reserve, and I agree "with him on this point". The Department desires to know whether advantage has resulted from the Agent's residence at Griswold.
