In a letter of April the 23rd, the Premier of New Brunswick informed the Prime Minister that the New Brunswick Legislature in a resolution of April the 14th requested the Federal government to defer a consideration of unemployment insurance legislation until after the submission of the report of the Royal Commission on Dominion-Provincial Relations.

In a letter of February the 3rd, 1938, the Premier of Alberta promised to place the proposals of the Federal government before the Alberta Legislature, but no further official intelligence was received from Alberta respecting this.
