in London, on the 13th. of January, 1943, was improperly in possession of stolen articles, namely, one Trilby hat, one serge suit, one silk tie, the property of No. 973891 LAC Honeyman, W.M. of the RAF.

FOURTH CHARGE SECTION 24(1) ARMY ACT Making away with his clothing,

in London, on the 6th of January, 1943, did leave in a room in the Union Jack Club one Battle Dress Blouse, One Battle Dress Trousers, one Field Service Cap, one First Field Dressing, one Cap Badge and onepair of woollen gloves, all articles of Government clothing on issue to him.
