

Isaac Groff, Gilton postoffice, breeds registered shorthorn cattle, and is an exporter of cattle and horses. Is a well-known horseman, and extensive buyer and shipper of heavy draft, carriage and roadster horses, and enjoys the confidence of horsemen generally.

J. Hugo Reed, V. S., Guelph, graduated from the Toronto Veterinary College, in 1882, and located in Guelph, where he has won for himself a good practice and a good name among stockmen generally. Is a dealer in saddle horses, and an importer and breeder of trotting and road horses. In 1887 imported from Kentucky the promising young stallion Lexington, Junior, sired by the standard bred horse Lexington. Goldust, his dam, being Alice by Medock Morgan, and a standard bred mauling stallion Wilson Barr (No. 7, 191, vol. 7, Wallace's American Trotting Register), raised by Major Barr, he by Wilson, and he by George Wilkes; dam Ella B. by Red Wilkes, she by George Wilkes.

P. Spragge, Guelph, proprietor of a large and well-equipped livery, sale and boarding stable, is one of the most prominent, reliable and well-known horsemen in this part of the country, his name being as familiar as household words. Enjoys quite a local reputation as an importer and breeder of pure bred Scotch collie dogs, having sent a number of this kind to British Columbia. Horses bought and sold on commission.

Thos. Gowdy, Guelph, manufacturer of agricultural implements, is an admirer of good horses, and breeder of trotting stock from such fashionably bred brood mares as Sarah G. sired by Zilardi Goldust (4,400), W. T. R. dam by Bunker Hill, a son of Green Mountain Black Hawk. (In 1887 Sarah G. was bred to Jerome Turner, record 2:15 1/2.) Queen Goldust by Lexington Goldust, he by Goldust, dam Alice by Medock Morgan, and he by Vermont Morgan. He also has some stock of the famous Tippeo breed.

Wm. Whitelaw, Guelph, Ont., breeder of registered shorthorn Durham cattle, and has for many years been a prominent and well-known importer and breeder of Borden Leicester sheep. Among his recent importations are some exceptionally fine animals from the herd of Lord Polworth, who is probably the most noted breeder of Borden Leicesters in Scotland; also breeds Shropshire down sheep. Mr. Whitelaw's herd of cattle consists of a number of fine females, mostly of the Bates strain, with a pure bred Crickshank bull, (bred by John Dryden, M. P. P., of Brooklin), at the head of the herd, and are all registered in the D. S. H. H. B. Keeps on hand both pure bred cattle and sheep for sale.

Smith Evans, Gourcock postoffice, proprietor of Willow Grove Stock Farm, is an importer and breeder of Oxford down and Cotswold sheep. His stock are all either imported or bred direct from imported stock. Has exported a number to the States. Keeps on hand good young stock for sale.

Thomas McCrae, Janesville, Guelph, Ont., is an extensive importer, exporter and breeder of Galloway and Polled Angus cattle, Clydesdale horses and Cotswold sheep. Is the oldest and most widely known importer of Galloways in Ontario, or probably America, having been largely engaged in the business since 1861. His herd comprises many very fine animals, both male and female, and he seldom has less than from forty to sixty head on hand. His imported registered Clydesdale brood mares are first class, and their progeny by imported sires should deserve the attention of intending purchasers.
