HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion hands in Manutolas or his Northwest Peritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homestends, or reserved to provide woc-lots for actiliers, or for other purposes, may be sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter sec-tion of 100 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Whithjeep, or the Local Agent for authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestcad is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to gr-sidence prior to obtaining patent may fee satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-sure that the presence of the presence of the for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vieinity of the first

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acros of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his cutry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applies tion for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to
