MASTERS AND SEAMEN THE MERCHANT SERVICE.

NOTICE is again hereby given, that the undersigned is duly authorized to carry into effect the British Act of the 5th and 6th of William the 4th, respecting Masters and Seamen in the Merchant Service.

To enable the Masters to receive the necessary Documents—that they are, by the said Act, to take home all balances of wages due to Seamen left on shore, in hospital, or elsewhere, and the wife of duty, must be paid into his hands, and no other person can, on any account, lawfully receive the same.

Also, that all Seamen who may have been left on shore, and unable to do their duty, will be furnished with information how to act in such cases. And the Master that will give a passage to England to any such seamen, will be furnished with Documents to enable them to receive the amount of their retailing account, on their arrival, from the President and Go. of the Corporation for relief and support of sick, maimed, and disabled seamen, and the widow and children of seamen as sh. be killed, slain or drowned in the Merchant service, and for other purposes.—at the office of the 4th and 5th William 4th, cap. 52.
