The visit to Canada of Mr. G. Marconi, the inventor of the system of wireless telegraphy which bears his name, again draws attention to stocks of wireless telegraph com-panies. He will personally direct the completion of the Can-adian station at Glace Bay. He claims that his system is ahead of all other wireless systems in practical use.
