Regins, Sask., April 2:— In the presence of learned legal counsel and before their Lordships Mr. Justice Brown and Mr. Justice Elwood of the Röyal Commission, Hon George Langley, Minister of Municipal Affairs, yesterday, morning provided the most dramatic and interesting situation that has been developed since the beginning of the investigation of the Bradshaw charges two weeks ago.

The Minister of Municipal Affairs was one of the several members of the Sask-atchewan Legislature whose names were connected with the charge of receiving money from hotelmen in return for influence used in securing licences. Mr. Langley's cross-examination of the man who has placed his name over all the charges that have been laid so recently at the feet of the Scott Government will be long remembered in this Province. It formed the picture of a rugged, honest Englishman, sturdy and belligerent despite an age of more than three-score years, assailing, with wounded pride, one who had sought to soil a reputation that had been won thru twenty-four years of constant association with the agricultural people of the West. He made Mr. Bradshaw admit that he knew nothing about the charge that had been faid against him, and in doing so he made Mr. Bradshaw confess that he was not acquainted with the conditions under which the Royal Commission was sitting.

In conclusion Mr. Langley took the stand in order to make the following statement, which should be included in the official report of the enquiry; "During the ten years I have been in public life I have never taken a dollar from any Lacense Commissioner or license holder or hotel man at any time. I want to say that I have had applications from thousands of men and women in trouble mostly because of my connection with the farmers' movement, since I have been in public life, and have never taken a dollar or the value of a dollar during the whole time. I want to state this, further, that if I should ever descend to graft I should not take it second-hand or from a lawyer, because I should not get anything."
