The House divided on the question:

## Yeas 20 Nays 12

ORDERED, that the faid order of the day be postponed 'till to-morrow.

**RESOLVED**, that this Houfe will, to-morrow, refolve itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe, to confider further the faid Meffage.

Mr. Solicitor General, from the Committee to whom was referred the Bill for applying a further fum of money towards the building and completing of a Common Gaol for the Diftrict of Montreal, reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made feveral amendments thereto, which they had directed him to fubmit to the Houfe; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the Bill, with the amendments, in at the Clerk's table, where the amendments were read once throughout.

On motion of Mr. Papineau, fenior, feconded by Mr. Larue;

- ORDERED, that the Bill and amendments be committed to a Committee of the whole House.
- RESOLVED, that this Houfe will, on Wednesday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the said Bill and amendments.

Then, on motion of Mr. Papineau, junior, feconded by Mr. Huot: The Houfe adjourned.
