Expences for the Court-House, Goal, &c. leaves a Ballance due by him to the Government of £12. 6. 5. Desides which, it appears, there is also due by Sundry Persons at Louisbourg, for Duties, the Sum of £89. 16. 10.

Refolv'd, That the Charge made by the faid Collector of £40. for a Waiter and Guager, and of £19. 0. 6.1 for fundry Expences, for a Court-House, Goal, &c. are not provided for by any Vote or Resolution of the General Assembly.

Refolv'd, That it does not appear to this House, that any Account has been rendered to the Treafury, of any Monies receiv'd for Duties of Impost and Excise, or Licenses, in Queen's County notwithstanding a Considerable Quantity of Spirituous Liquors are consumed there;

Refolv'd, That it appears to this House, that in the Account of the Collector of Impost and Excise Duties at Lunenburg, there is a charge of £4. for a Gauger, which charge is not provided for by any Vote or Resolution of the General Assembly.

Refolv'd, That it appears to this House, that the Charge for Stationary to the different Offices amounts to £103. 16. 1. which exceeds, by £53. 16. 1. the Sums allowed for that Purpose, by Votes or Resolutions of the General Assembly;

Refolw'd, That it appears to this House, that there has been paid the Sum of £56. 17. 6. as a Salary to the first Justice of the Inserior Lourt at Halifax, and that there is a further Demand of £34. 12. 6. for the same Purpose, neither of which are provided for by any Vote or Resolution of the General Assembly;

Refolv'd, That it appears to this House, that the Sum of £25. has been paid to Joseph Woodmass, Esq; as Keeper of the Light-house, and Assistants for one Quarter, which Payment is not provided
