Without character there was no salvation from sin; weakness and wickedness. To develop character, self-control was required, and self-control is the trained muscle," said the speaker, who is the organ of the will. The controlled muscles control the individual actions. Mr. J. Howard Crocker, formerly secretary of the local Y.M.C.A., was cited as an instance of a man who had a grip on himself. They had been associated together when boys, living in New Brunswick. The boys used to go down to the beach and play in the morning when getting into training for Victoria Day sports. Crocker was always first on the track, thus demonstrating the mastery he had over himself. He had followed the movements of Crocker, who is now in China, and throughout his life he had demonstrated that he had a grip on himself. Speaking further of the grip a man should have on himself, he said men in houses of refuge and jails were flabby in muscle and in will-power. The committing of sin was believed by some boys to be an evidence of manliness, but this was a mistake.

Must Sacrifice.
For the boy who was willing to sacrifice there were many cases of requiring their service. The temperance question was not yet settled, the child labor question, the capital and labor question, and the white slave traffic. Several instances in which boys had made a stand for what was right were cited. In a certain high school the entire school had written the examinations over again because it was thought that some had had access to the questions previous to the examination. A boy had exposed a man who was selling obscene literature. Still another boy had exposed a man who was teaching his mates violence. The last-mentioned boy had said: "I don't care if it kills me. For the sake of the other fellow I will do it."

There were two laws of life—the law of the beast and the law of God. If the law of the beast is followed, there is deterioration; but if the law of God is followed, there is expansion. The boy should ask himself: "How much of an asset am I to God?" The speaker in his concluding remarks said: "Wanted that every boy could catch a vision of Christ, who came to minister, and not to be ministered unto."

Mr. Forgie announced that there were eight conferences now in progress in the Provinces and the States. A telegram conveying greetings was read and approved of by the conference. Mr. Taylor Station, at present in the West, will also receive the message. The meeting was concluded by singing "Onward, Christian Soldiers."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
ANY PERSON who is the sole owner of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader who good standing may pre-empt a quarter section of land. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate 20 acres extra.
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts, price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500.
