SAYS LACK OF MEN CAUSE OF GALLIPOLI DISASTER



(GENERAL SIR IAN HAMILTON)

In an exhaustive report to the British War Office General Hamilton, late commander of the Gallipoli campaign, paid high tribute to the troops who stormed Turkish heights and related that more than fifty per cent of the men in some units fell in the great four day battle. In his report he stated that failure of water supply and lack of 50,000 men prevented victory at Gallipoli.
