BOLSHEVIKI AND I.W.W. By Courier Leased Wire Chicago, May 11.—Members of the Bolsheviki Party in Russia were corresponding with the Industrial Workers of the World here in August 1917, relative to activities in America, according to evidence submitted by the government in the trial of 112 I.W.W. leaders for seditious conspiracy. Letters, antedating by only a few weeks the Russian revolution that placed the Bolsheviki in power, sought information from William D. Haywood and others as to the progress being made in the campaign, "take America from the capitalists and bring about industrial freedom." Letters from various parts of Russia urged immediate shipment of I.W.W. literature. "The sentiment is good all over Russia," said one of the letters.
