WARNING!

IN THE INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY.

The Rifle Range on the South Side Hill will be in constant use, from daylight till dark, for musketry practice, until our Regiment leaves for England.

All persons are therefore prohibited from approaching the Rifle Range within 200 yards from either side, or within 1,000 yards of the targets to the eastward.

Any unauthorized person so doing will be liable to arrest, besides incurring serious danger from rifle bullets. A number of red flags will be used to indicate the Danger Zone. This prohibition does not extend to any part of the Hills west of the 800 yards Firing Point.
