

A panel of royal blue morocco containing the royal arms in the centre of the front cover is inlaid with the heraldic colours. The book contains 175 sheets of stout paper boards. It is sewn with twine in the old-fashioned way round six stout hempen ropes (each rope containing seventy strands of hemp), much thicker than the ordinary clothes-line. Four of these ropes are laced into millboards half an inch thick, which form the coundation for the leather covering. In order to hasten the handling of the book during the various processes of binding, a staging was erected, from the cross-beams of which depended an iron chain and pulley block, without which it would have required six men to manipulate the
