

The formal proclamation putting into effect the new Labor treaty with Great Britain has been issued by President Coolidge, after a n exchange of ratifications with Ser ty. Hughes and Ambassador Howart I, representing their respective covernments. The proclamation is in the form of a public announcement of the Treaty which it sets out in full. The Treaty will remain in force chi year from this date and if no notice is served during the year and if there is no deisre to modify the pact it will continue on force another year adid so on. MAURETANIA ESTABLISHES NEW SPEED RECORD.

SOUTHAMPTON, May 23. The Cunard liner Mauretania, returning here from Cherbourg, where her turbines were rebladed, was tested for speed over a 28 mile course off th Isle of Wight, and declared to have beaten her original record established in 1911. She ran 14 miles with tide and 14 against, averaging 26.4 knots; but officials say that during the run with the tide she touched 31 knots which, they claim, is the fastest speed attained by an mercantile ship in the world.

MALARIA SPREADING IN RESSHA. LENINGRAD, Russia, May 13. Malaria and other diseases are spreading alarmingly throughout Russia as there is an acute shortage of quinine and other essential drugs, according to a report presented to the Epidemiological Congress here vesterday. There were more than six million cases of malaria in Russia typhus, 250,000 cases of recurrent typhus, and 50,000 cases of scurvy. The large stocks of quinine and other


