"The Synod urges the clergy to im press upon their congregations and to emphasize in every way possible the duty of being ready to make sacrifices for the sake of religion in order that the love of God may become a living power in the lives of all.

"Convinced that what the world needs is a living witness and visible demonstration of the love and power of God, the Synod places the personal life and example of the clergy as an outstanding religious need, and therefore calls the attention of the members of the clergy to the solemn yow of Ordination binding them to fashion their lives according to the doctrines of Christ and to make themselves wholesome examples to the flock of Christ, and urges upon every parish priest the insistent ne cessity of systematically devoting a definite portion of each day to meditation and sacred study, with a view to the upholding and development of his own personal spiritual life.
