March 4. Attorney-General Mowat introduced a Bill to amend the Public and High School Act.

Attorney-General, Mowat introduced a Bill to amend the Public and High School Act. On motion-of Hon. Mr. Parlee, the House went into Committee on the Bill to provide for the establishment of a hospital for the reclamation and cure of habitual drunkards. The term of con-guence and the bill to amended was passed. On motion of Hon. Mr. McKellar the House went into Committee, and passed a Bill to provide for the incorporation of Immigration Aid Societies in Ontario. The bill to extend the franchise for the election of members of the Legislative Assembly was discharged. Hon. Mr. Crooks moved the second reading of the Sill respecting the position of the Port Whitby and Port Perry Rail-way Company under the Acts in aid of railways. He explained that the object of the Bill was to enabe this Company to make an application to the Governor in Council for aid out of the railway fund; and referred to English precedent to show that this was a public Bill.
