liberty of conscience than that to which he belongs.

The British Registrar estimates the population of the United Kingdom in the middle of this year, 1874, at 33,412,010, being 600,000 more than double what it was in 1801. The contrast, however, in the different countries that form the United Kingdom is very marked. The population of Ireland in 1874—viz., 5,300,485—is only \$4,000 more than it was in 1801. The population of Scotland in 1874 is 3,42,916, or 212,000 more than double what it was in 1801. while the present population of England and Wales is 23,648,607, or about five and a half millions more than double what it was in 1801.
