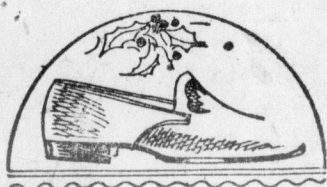

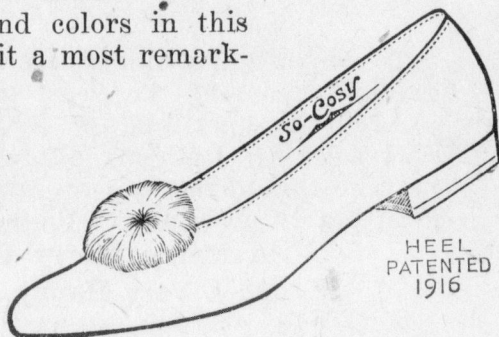

state, and give it a new start. He
made Himself the starting point, and
required that all who would join
themselves to Him should become
like Him. He required of them that
they should experience a new birth
through the operation of the Holy
Spirit, and that He Himself should
enter their lives and control all their
activities. He whose birth we cele-
brate on Christmas day became a
luminary to earth shining into the
hearts and minds of men with a
strength that had never been experi-
enced before. That Babe became
the light of the world; making the
age of His shining the most lumin-
ous and glorious of all the ages.
There never was an age when the
spirit of philanthropy was so dom-
inant as it is now. The poor, the
sick, the aged, the infirm, long ne-
glected of the human kind, are now
being cared for by loving hearts and

inent divine, one of the most power-
fully eloquent of Baptist ministers,
moved the audience to its feet at the
afternoon session on Monday, when
he spoke on "Some Needs in the Re-
demption of Africa." He appealed to
the sacred honor of every Negro in
the United States, saying that God
had given the American Negro this
freedom in order to make it possible
for the larger freedom of the world
—Africa in particular. Dr. Morris
mentioned the needs of a hospital
to conserve the splendid heroic pi-
oneers who leave America and must
be nursed until they are acclimatized
and also to nurse missionaries when
they are sick. He also mentioned as
one of the great needs an African
Tuskegee where the natives of Lib-
eria could be taught up-to-date farm-
ing and the industries.
