

(Continued from Page 1) inent divine, one of the most powerfully eloquent of Baptist ministers, moved the audience to its feet at the afternoon session on Monday, when he spoke on "Some Needs in the Redemption of Africa." He appealed to the sacred honor of every Negro in the United States, saying that God had given the American Negro this freedom in order to make it possible for the larger freedom of the world -Africa in particular. Dr. Morris mentioned the needs of a hospital to conserve the splendid heroic pioneers who leave America and must be nursed until they are acclimatized and also to nurse missionaries when they are sick. He also mentioned as one of the great needs an African Tuskegee where the natives of Liberia could be taught up-to-date- farming and the industries.


