





London, Sept. 1.-The United States members of the Alaskan boundary tri-bunal arrived in London Sunday. Sir Louis Jette and Mr. Sifton arrived yesterday. In an interview, the United States commissioners state that even if the tribunal fails to reach an agreement it will have the effect of clear-ing the air on the question.

Lord Chief Justice Alvestone, the British member of the Alaskan boundary commission, called on Elihu Root, yesterday morning, and Ambassador Choate called on him later. John W. Foster, former United States secretary of state, saw Mr. Choate in the afternoon, and they discussed the final arrangements for the meeting of the commission at the foreign office Thursday. 
