## Appoints Police Magistrate In Brantford For One Month

Deputy Attorney-General Bayley Picks Colonel Massie of Dunnville To Have Exclusive Jurisdiction in Louis Stander Cases.

(Special to The Advertiser.)

BRANTFORD, Dec. 8.—Louis Stander, police court interpreter, fined \$1,000 and given a month in jail for selling alcohol, has appealed the case, and has been freed on \$5,000 bail.

Today Magistrate Livingston received from Deputy Attorney-General E. Bayley a letter explaining why Magistrate Massie of Dunnville had been called in to try the cases in which Stander is implicated.

In part the letter received by Magistrate Livingston read: "The attorney-general does not desire to cause

you the embarrassment of trying cases where a man who is practically an official of your court is said to be involved, and he has therefore requested Col. Massie of Dunnville to try them. "In order that there may be no slip up Col. Massie is authorized pursuant to the police magistrate's act, section 23, to act as police magistrate for the city of Brantford and for the county of Brant for the period of one month so that all the cases may be disposed of."

"This, of course, does not affect your jurisdiction except in the cases which Col. Massie will try."

## LOSES RUDDER CALLS FOR HELP

MONCTON, N. B., Dec. 8.—A Bathurst dispatch to a newspaper here says: The steamer Bethlehem, with a cargo of coal from Sydney, N. S., for Campbellton, N. B., lost her rudder while off Shippigan and was compelled to anchor and send for aid. She is lying some six miles off Shippigan Island. It is expected that the government tug Stanley will be dispatched to the scene.

The weather outlook is rather threatening, and the vessel would undoubtedly be lost if a storm should arise while she is in her present helpless condition.

## HOLD KINGSVILLE BOY FOR PERJURY

Walkerville Police Seek Death Car Driver As Slayer.

WINDSOR, Dec. 8.—Charged with perjury, Charles Malott, 19 years old, formerly of Kingsville, now rooming at a Walkerville hotel, this afternoon was arrested by Walkerville police. He was arraigned before Magistrate Gundy, who allowed bail of \$500. Malott is alleged to have given false testimony at the inquest into the death of Jack Chittin, the Walkerville youth killed a month ago, when an automobile turned turtle after striking a horse and buggy, driven by a Sandwich East farmer, on Walker road. Ray Bartow, also of Walkerville, driver of the car, is being sought on a charge of manslaughter.

## EXPECT CONTEST FOR EVERY SEAT

Galt Citizens Showing Interest in Coming Civic Elections.

GALT, Dec. 8.—The local branch of the G. W. V. A. has elected the following officers for 1922: President, J. Neill; vice-president, E. Matthews; treasurer, L. Evans; secretary, E. Pilkington; executive, F. Fellingham, R. Peacock, C. Leith, S. Jones, A. Drew, S. Law, A. Williams, R. Whitcomb, W. Horsey and G. Craikshanks. With the smoke of one election cleared away the contest for municipal honours looms up, and reports are that there will be contests for 24 aldermanic positions.
