Pana, Ill., March 31.—The first actual stoppage of work in the Southern Illinois coal fields occurred shortly before noon today, when 800 miners packed their tools and went home.

Officially their suspension of work was set to begin tonight at midnight, but virtually it was to start six hours ahead of schedule for most miners and their shift in the mines at that hour.
