

SEES NO NEED OF EMERGENCY

Fuel Controller Advises Municipalities To Co-operate With Local Dealers.

Promises To Restrict Anthracite Sales Until Welsh Coal Is Sold.

TORONTO, Aug. 16.—Provided that immediate action is taken on the part of the Ontario municipalities in co-operation with each other and with the coal dealers of this province, there will be no real coal famine during the coming winter. Such is the view of J. A. Ellis, provincial fuel controller, as expressed before a conference of 120 representatives of Ontario municipalities held at the Parliament buildings today. Purchase of Welsh bituminous coal, either admirably or smokeless, was the measure advised by the fuel controller.

Although no concrete action grew out of the conference, those present learned a good deal about the situation as it affects the province generally, and the individual consumer in particular.

May Avoid Crisis.
"There will be no real emergency in the fuel situation in Ontario, if the coal dealers, the municipal councils and the general public will look the situation in the face and promptly take the measures which I believe ought to be taken," stated Fuel Controller Ellis in his general statement which he read to the meeting. He continued, in part, as follows:

"There will be an emergency if matters are allowed to drift in the expectation that Ontario will get its full supply of coal from the States. From the best information which I can obtain, even with the strikes ended, there will be a shortage in the supply of anthracite of about one-third the usual supply. At present no anthracite is being produced, and up to the present 60 per cent of the bituminous mines in the States have also been closed down. When all these mines begin to operate again there may then possibly be a railway congestion. There is, therefore, no certainty that the shortage in the supply of anthracite can be made up with a surplus in the supply of bituminous coal from the States."

Favors Welsh Coal.
The best available coal, in Mr. Ellis' opinion, was Welsh steam coal. "I am informed that this coal can still be purchased. It is not going to be easy to get this coal in any quantity throughout Ontario. It will have to go to Montreal, where the unloading facilities are only of a certain capacity, and there would be the problem of getting sufficient railway cars at Montreal whenever the shipment comes in."

Mr. Ellis concurred in a suggestion to memorialize the Dominion government to remove the duty on Welsh coal.

Asked to his powers of investigating coal dealers' accounts, Mr. Ellis said he had full powers to do so, and if complaints were made of profiteering, he undoubtedly would investigate, and if necessary order price revision.

Continuing his statement, Mr. Ellis said:

20,000 tons of Welsh anthracite, part of which is already on the way. I have promised to issue an order, if necessary, prohibiting the sale of American anthracite, even if it comes in, until this supply of Welsh anthracite is disposed of. If, in any other case, I issue a similar order if necessary. If, therefore, any particular dealers in any locality do not purchase Welsh steam coal or any other kind of fuel which can be used in the fall as a substitute for American anthracite, and leave the burden upon coal dealers in that locality, they will find themselves unable to sell their American anthracite, even if it happens to come in earlier than is anticipated.

MAKES NEW OFFER.

CALGARY, Aug. 17.—The Western Canada Coal Operators' Association today made a new offer to miners of District No. 18, United Mine Workers of America, to resume work on the working conditions at a reduction of 20 per cent in wages. The agreement would be continuous until March 31, 1923, but that any schedule adopted by at least 80 per cent of the United States coal operators would supersede this new scale.

The miners are considering the offer, and probably they will accept.

PARLEY HEADS HOPEFUL.

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 17.—The conference of anthracite operators' and miners' representatives adjourned tonight at 5:30 o'clock, until 3 p.m. tomorrow.

John L. Lewis, president of the mine workers, and Samuel D. Warren, head of the Operators' Association, in a statement issued jointly, were optimistic as to the outcome, but said that they would have to have separate conferences between themselves and their colleagues.

RATIFY PLAN TO TAKE COMPANY AT ST. THOMAS

TORONTO, Aug. 17.—A proposal by J. T. O'Connor, Kingston retail merchant, to take over the assets of the Provincial Machine and Supply Company of St. Thomas, has been ratified by the registrar in bankruptcy.

The company assigned July 15, with assets of \$33,336.85, and liabilities of \$20,522.97, and on July 25 applied for an extension of time for payment of debts. Almost all the creditors are in Toronto and Montreal. Creditors discussed the affairs of the company in the office of Humphrey, Colquhoun & Co., trustees.

LET PEOPLE STAND FIRM, LAST MESSAGE OF GRIFFITH

Words Written When Dail Cabinet Decided to Attend Meeting at Sligo.

DUBLIN, Aug. 17.—Let the people stand firm for the Free State. It is a national need and economic salvation. Love to the Irish people, and all my colleagues and friends. These are the words of the last message of Arthur Griffith to the Irish people, written on April 15, when the president of the Dail Eireann Cabinet decided to attend a meeting at Sligo. The message is to be printed in tomorrow's edition of Young Ireland, Griffith's paper.

In an explanatory note, the editor writes that Mr. Griffith, anticipating a possibility of serious consequences arising out of the action of those who seized Sligo, wrote the statement, which remained unopened until a few days after his death.

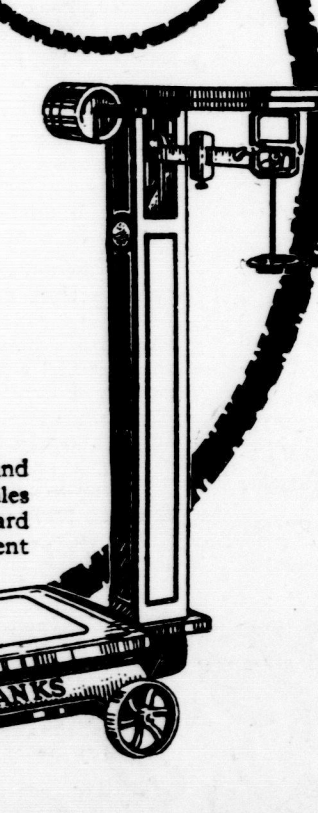

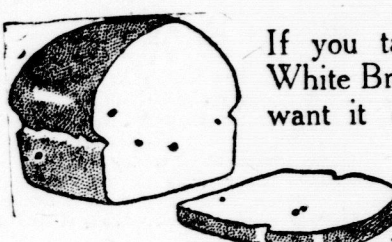

STATES 1922 BEST YEAR FOR HYDRO

Sir Adam Beck Gives Interesting Statement On Development of System.

TORONTO, Aug. 1.—In presenting the 1921 annual report of the hydro-electric power commission of Ontario, Sir Adam Beck states, in a preface: "Despite the continued commercial depression prevailing throughout the year and the continued high cost of material and labor, the commission is again able to state that this year's operation is the most successful in its history. This is especially true

of the Wasdells system, the Muskoka system and the Niagara system."

An interesting comparative table on consolidated operating report shows the remarkable growth of the hydro municipalities since the year 1911. The number of municipalities has jumped from 45 to 215, and their total assets from 10 to 40 millions, while in same period total liabilities jumped from 10 to only 25 millions. Reserves have increased from \$478,000 to \$6,292,107. Total surplus has increased from \$961,000 to \$3,355,613, and the percentage of net debt to total assets has decreased from 85 per cent to 63.3 per cent.

The surplus, less depreciation for 1921, is \$619,726, but it is fully explained in the report that this year's operation returns to the consumers.

MEETS DEATH TRYING TO STOP RUNAWAY HORSES

KALADAR, Aug. 17.—When he attempted to stop a runaway team of horses today, S. H. Drysdale, proprietor of the Wickwire House, at Clyde, 14 miles north of here, was knocked down and killed. He was 80 years of age, and leaves a wife and grown-up family. For many years he was a farmer on Wolfe Island, near Kingston.
