SUGAR

New York, Oct. 14.—Raw sugar was unchanged today. Prices for some Cubans, partly paid. Sales reported were 5,500 bags of Venezuelan and 3,500 bags of Cuban.

Trade buying and covering caused a gradual rise in prices for raw sugar futures, but reactions followed on commission-house selling. Higher prices were met lower on October 14 and unchanged to 4 points higher on October 15. Prices for 11 months' delivery were \$3.92, March \$3.22, May \$3.22, July \$3.21. Only moderate inquiry was reported for the sugar futures, but prices for fine granulated were nominal.

BUTTER AND EGGS

Montreal, Oct. 15.—Butter and eggs butted for a while. Importers were active and some large transactions were recorded, and the market continued firm.
