Synopsis of City Hall By-Law

(1) On the 8th day of November, 1923, a bylaw was read a first and second time by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of London to authorize the issue of \$500,000 debenture for the erection of the new City Hall upon what is known as the McCormick site, in the City of London, and in order to do so it is estimated that in addition to the money already provided for the erection of the City Hall, there will be required this further sum of \$500,000.
(2) The amount of the debt or liability to be created is \$500,000.
(3) The debt or liability is to be payable, according to the terms of the draft bylaw, in 20 years from the 30th day of June, 1924.
(4) The amount to be raised annually for the payment of the debt and the interest, the installment, is \$40,121.30.

Take Notice

1. That the foregoing is a synopsis of a proposed bylaw of the Corporation of the City of London, to be submitted to the votes of the electors at the same time and at the same places, as the annual election for the municipal council, and the electors returning officers appointed to hold the said election shall take the vote.
2. And that the 25th day of November, A.D. 1923, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon in the City Hall in the said municipality, has been fixed for the appointment of persons to attend at the polling places and at the final summing up of the votes by the clerk.
And that, if the assent of the electors is obtained to the said proposed bylaw, it will be taken into consideration by the Municipal Council of the said Corporation at a meeting thereof to be held after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice, and that such first publication was made on the 9th day of November, A.D. 1923.
TAKE FURTHER THAT a tenant who desires to vote upon the said proposed bylaw must deliver to the clerk on or before the 10th day before the day appointed for taking the vote, a declaration, under the Canada Evidence Act, that he is a tenant whose lease extends for the time for which the debt or liability is to be created, or in which the money to be raised by the proposed bylaw is payable or for at least 21 years, and that he has, by the lease, covenanted to pay all municipal taxes in respect of the property of which he is tenant, other than the local improvement rates.

Mr. C. Johnson, general manager of the Windsor Company, will act as sales manager of the Brantford Roofing Company.

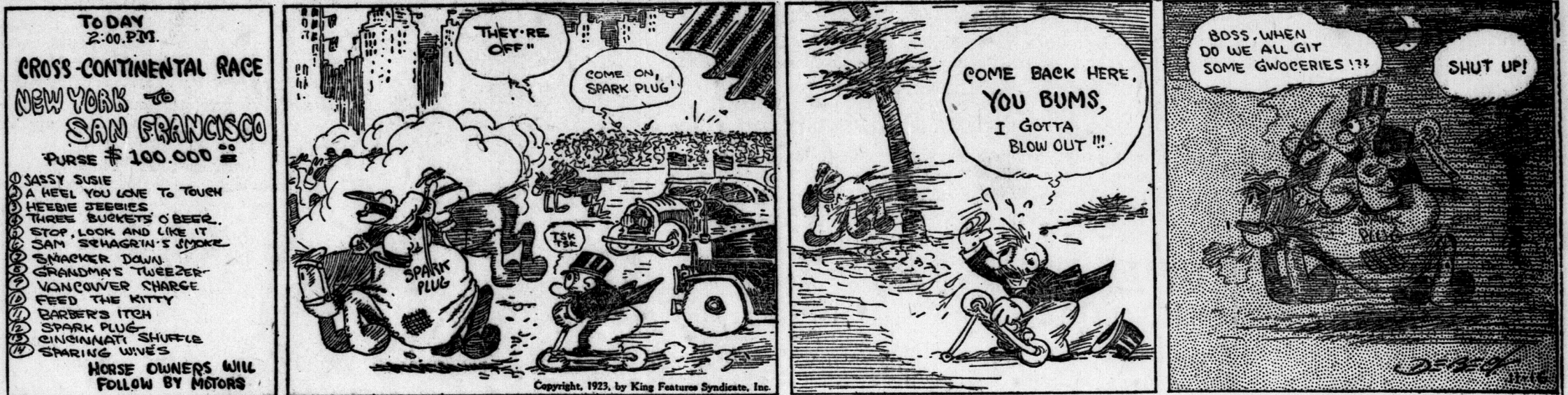

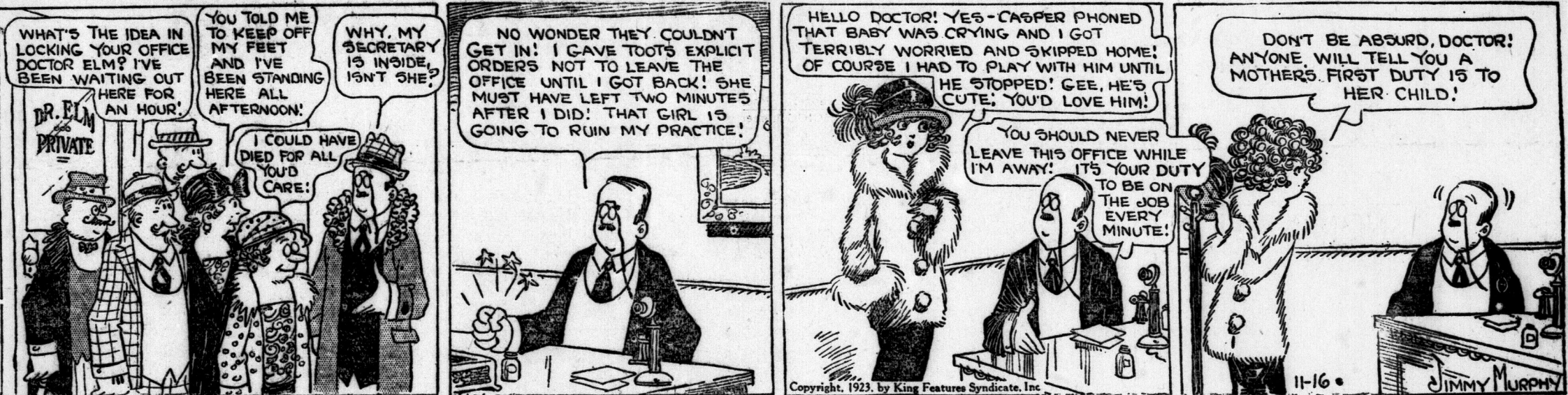
