Synopsis of City Hall

By-Law

(1) On the 8th day of November, 1923, a bylaw was read a first and second time by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of London to authorize the issue of \$500,000 debenture for the erection of the new City Hall upon what is known as the McCormick site, in the City of London, and in creder to do so it is estimated that in addition to the money already provided for the erection of a City Hall, there will be required the further sum of \$500,000.

(2) The amount of the debt or liability to be created is \$500,000.00.

(3) The debt or liability is to be payable, according to the terms of the draft bylaw, in 20 years' from the 30th day of June, 1924.

(4) The amount to be raised annually for the payment of the debt and the interest, or the installment, is \$40,121.30.


