The Treasurer's Report was read and ordered to be laid on the table. Ordered that the Treasurer pay \$500.00 to the Annapolis County Farmers' Association as a contribution towards the construction of the Agricultural Demonstration Building at Lawrence town.

Ordered that Collins Hardwick be relieved of two days road work from District No. 28, Ward No. 10.

Ordered that a Committee be appointed to look into the sanitary conditions of the Court House and Jail. The following Committee was appointed: Councillors Bishop, Thomas, Elliott, and Foster, with the Warden and Claude E. King as ex officio members.

Ordered that the first three quarters of a mile of public road leading from the main road in Mochelle near the bridge to Lake La Rose, be made a Road District and numbered Sec. No. 34 in Ward No. 10.

Council adjourned till Wednesday morning.

Wednesday Morning

Council met at 10 a. m. All present, excepting Councillor Withers. Ordered that the Report of the Commissioners of Public Grounds be referred back to the supervisors, and that they be requested to make a report to conform with Act Chapter 79, Volume 1, Revised Statutes, 1900.

Ordered that the Report of the Commission on Saunders Road Section No. 7, Ward No. 10, be received and adopted. The following is the report:

To the Municipal Council of the County of Annapolis:

Your Committee appointed to enquire into, and if necessary, lay out a new piece of road in Road District No. 7, Ward 10, to join two parts of said road more conveniently and at less expense than at present, beg leave to report that they have examined the said location, and are of the opinion that the proposed new road would be a benefit to all parties concerned. It would end the present dispute with a number of the marsh owners, and would be more convenient for some of the residents of the Section and equally convenient for the rest of them.

We have laid out a new road two rods in width, beginning at the south-west corner of Benjamin William's marsh and running northerly along his western line taking the width of the road off G. W. Shipton's marsh, with the exception of a small triangular piece taken off the William's marsh, to the upland, thence following the fence, between the marsh and upland in a north-easterly direction taking the width of road off J. F. Tupper's pasture to the public road leading from the Saunders Road to G. W. Shipton's as the accompanying plan will more fully show.

We have made agreements with G. W. Shipton for land damages, fencing, etc., for \$42.00, with J. F. Tupper for land damages, fencing, etc., for \$75.00, and with Benjamin Williams for land damages, fencing, etc., for \$15.00.

Said agreements are hereto attached.



There have been terrific gales in many places all over the world, but the highest wind velocity ever recorded in the United States was 141 miles an hour at Cape Mendocino, Cal., in January, 1886. The anemometer at Cape Lookout on the Atlantic Coast, registered 138 miles an hour, August 17, 1879, and then blew down.

The 500 miles of trenches on the first line between the North Sea and Switzerland, with five or six trenches on each side of it, have involved twice as much excavation as the Panama Canal. And it was done by hard labor.
