A NEW PAPER.

FOR nearly two years a number of Christian men and women have been praying in regard to the establishment of a City Mission, and the erection of a Hall in which the Gospel might be preached to the poor, every night. The answer has been received. The Toronto Mission Union has been established, and "Our Mission Union Hall" erected, and will be opened on the 24th inst. In connection with the Union, a fortnightly paper has been established.
