The Department of External Affairs today announced the following appointments:

Mr. R. Harry Jay as Canadian High Commissioner to Jamaica. Mr. Jay, who is at present Deputy Permanent Representative in the Canadian Delegation to the North Atlantic Council suceeds Mr. G. C. McInnes.

Mr. Graham Campbell McInnes, as Canadian Permanent Delegate to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization in Paris, succeeding Mr. L.V.J. Roy.

<u>Mr. Jay</u>, who was born in Lachine, Quebec, on August 13, 1919, graduated from McGill University in 1948, and was called to the Bar of Quebec. Prior to this, from 1941 to 1945, Mr. Jay served with the Royal Canadian Air Force in the United Kingdom, and was held as a prisoner of war in Northwestern Europe. Mr. Jay joined the Department of External Affairs in 1948 and served in New Delhi from 1950 to 1953. In 1955 he was appointed as adviser to the Canadian Commissioner in the International Supervisory Commission for Vietnam. He served as First Secretary with the Canadian Permanent Mission to the United Nations in Geneva from 1956 to 1960, and as Deputy Permanent Representative of the Canadian Delegation to the North Atlantic Council, from 1963 to
