

Mr. Fraser, from the Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines, presented the First Report of the said Committee, which was read as follows:

Your Committee recommends:

1. That its quorum be reduced from 20 to 12 members and that Standing Order 65(1)(b) be suspended in relation thereto.
2. That it be empowered to print such papers and evidence as may be ordered by the Committee, and that Standing Order 66 be suspended in relation thereto.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Fraser, seconded by Mr. Murphy, the said Report was concurred in.

The following Questions were made Orders for Returns under the provisions of section 5 of Standing Order 39:

Question No. 19, by Mr. Howard,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. What are the names of the Indian Bands or Reserves which are within the Electoral District of Skeena?

2. Upon what dates since January 1, 1956, has (a) an Indian Superintendent; (b) a doctor; (c) a dentist, visited each band or reserve?

Question No. 30, by Mr. Martin (Essex East),—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. To what countries does Canada now export the Salk vaccine?

2. When were the first shipments of the Salk vaccine authorized for export to any receiving country?

3. How many children in Canada have received three shots of the Salk vaccine as of March 31, 1958?

4. What is the total financial contribution of the Federal Government under Dominion-Provincial arrangements for the free supply of the Salk vaccine, during the fiscal year ended March 31, 1958?

5. What is the age beyond which the Federal Government does not now contribute to the free supply of the Salk vaccine in any or all of the provinces?

6. What proportions of the Salk vaccine program in Canada are now manufactured at the Connaught Medical Research Laboratories, the Institute of Microbiology at the University of Montreal, and private manufacturers?

7. Is the Salk vaccine production in Canada provided by private manufacture in Canada or do all commercial supplies now come from the United States?

8. How many private commercial companies have received permission to sell and distribute the Salk vaccine in Canada?

9. Are the British controls or tests prior to use of the Salk vaccine the same as those provided in Canada?

Question No. 39, by Mr. Argue,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. How many passenger automobiles have been purchased or contracted for by the government during the present year to date?

2. Of such automobiles, how many are manufactured in (a) Canada; (b) The United States of America; (c) other countries?

3. For what purpose are cars in categories "b" and "c" being used?
