Mr. Marchand (Langelier), a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of (1) Report of the Airport Inquiry Commission.—Sessional Paper No. 301-4/60.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), seconded by Mr. Sharp,—That Bill C-49, An Act to amend the statute law relating to income tax, be now read a second time and referred to a Committee of the Whole.

Mr. Whittaker, seconded by Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich), moved,—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to bringing in

an amendment to the Old Age Security Act to ensure the Canadian veteran with overseas service that such service be counted for time in Canada for the purpose of the Old Age Security Act whether or not he has resided full-time after discharge in Canada—(*Notice of Motion No. 22*).

By unanimous consent, the motion was amended to read as follows:

That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to bringing in an amendment to the Old Age Security Act to ensure the Canadian veteran with overseas service that such service be counted as presence in Canada for the purpose of the Old Age Security Act whether or not he has resided full-time after discharge in Canada.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the motion, as amended, it was agreed to.
